WHO WE ARE

Queen's Health Outreach is a student run registered charity based on the campus of Queen's University in Kingston, ON. Our goal is to facilitate needs-based, peer-to-peer health discussions surrounding topics of mental, sexual, and physical health locally, nationally, and internationally.

QHO was founded by a group of medical students in 1987, as Queen's Medical Aid. As QHO has expanded over the years, our mandate has shifted from providing clinical and medical services to the establishment of health education initiatives, collaborating with communities to work towards sustainable opportunities for youth engagement, leadership, and health conversations.

Belize INITIATIVE

Belize has been doing amazing since the school year has begun. In the fall, we hired 8 hard working and committed Peer Educators who will be heading on initiative at the end of April. A lot of hard work has been dedicated to preparations for initiative in the spring. Peer educators have been attending education sessions each week for two hours that included guest speakers as well as example lessons that the peer educators will be teaching in the future. Each week we have been having meeting with only the members of the Belize initiative for approximately one hour each week. In the Belize specific meetings, PEs have been preparing their own mini presentations on different aspects of Belizean culture as well as sharing a current event through a news report. Cultural presentations that have been done so far include food, main attractions, holidays and traditions, government, language and slang, and recreational activities. Learning about the Belizean culture provides the PEs with a greater idea of what to expect while on initiative making way for a smooth transition in April. A lot of hard work and planning has gone into fundraising. On December 2nd, Belize is sold cookie dough in the athletic centre at Queen's. All proceeds will go towards the Belize initiative. As a group, we will be making the cookie dough together the night before the fundraiser, having a night of Christmas fun, pot luck dinner and lots of bonding among the Belize family. Another Belize fundraiser that is being done is a succulent sale during exam season. Students can purchase the succulents around campus as a holiday gift or a fun treat to themselves during a hard exam time. It is amazing to see the connections amongst the Belize PE's starting to develop so quickly, and just from the few events we've had, we can see how amazing they work in group environments! We are so excited to continue our discussions, practice teaching sessions, and bonding in the new year!

Jayana INITIATIVE

We are so excited to have hired six amazing PEs for the Guyana Initiative! We have gotten to know each other through our weekly initiative meetings, preparing for practice teaching, organizing fundraisers, and having a potluck dinner together!

In our weekly initiative specific meetings, we have been going over important cultural sensitivity topics and learning about the Guyanese culture. The PEs have done a fantastic job presenting these various topics, and they have stimulated really insightful discussions. Through these discussions the PEs have had the opportunity to learn about the education system in Guyana, as well as mental health and mental illness. We have been staying up to date with Guyana with weekly presentations about articles published in Kaieteur News. The PEs have all had the opportunity to give a practice lesson, and they all did a phenomenal job. The lessons they covered were: introduction to mental heath, substances and self esteem and peer pressure. We've gone over different questions we've received from the question box from students in previous years and everyone contributed great suggestions for how we might answer them in the classroom. We finish our meetings with a few minutes to reflect in our journals. This was a suggestion from M&E, and they have also provided the PEs with prompts to write about in preparation for initiative, as well as on initiative.

We all had a lot of fun at our first initiative specific fundraiser, which was a bake sale and raffle for Starbucks items. It was a great success and we are excited about announcing our next fundraiser soon!

Lingston INITIATIVE

The Kingston Initiative has been off to a great start this past semester. We began by hiring 13 amazing PE's in October. After that we kicked it off with two informative crash course sessions, where our PE's got the chance to learn more about QHO as a whole, met some of the executive members, and got the chance to bond a bit as a team. During the crash course we also had a wonderful guest speaker, Stephanie Sartor, who was a former elementary school educator, and is now a prominent member of the Limestone school board. She discussed helpful teaching tactics specific to the Kingston community, and cultural sensitivity issues within the classes. The education directors also came in and lead an awesome practice teaching session for our PE's so they felt super prepared before starting in the classrooms.

All of our Kingston PE's began teaching in the classrooms the week after Thanksgiving! We are teaching in 12 classrooms this year, and have branched out to other areas in the Kingston community including Kingsbridge Retirement Home. Our PE's have reported such positive experiences getting to know their classes, and have already begun with some really great lessons. Most of the classes have begun covering topics such as nutrition, healthy relationships, mental health and mindfulness. They have been utilizing the question box to gain feedback and questions on the topics they have already covered, and will use this information to plan great lessons for the coming semester.

In terms of our initiative as a whole, we have loved contributing to the QHO-wide fundraising efforts, and bonding as a team while doing so. In addition, at the beginning of December, the Kingston initiative officially ran our first initiative-specific fundraiser. We sold hot chocolate and candy canes outside of Stauffer Library by donation. It was a big success, and we are looking forward to even more initiative fundraising events next semester.

On that note, the Kingston initiative could not be more excited for January. We are especially looking forward to retreat, and to bonding even more closely as a team. As well, our PE's are already getting excited for planning their outreach days with their classes, which is when they plan an outing or onlocation fun event for the PE's and the classes to enjoy together. It is such an exciting experience, and our PE's have already brought up so many great ideas. The Kingston initiative has had such a busy and exciting semester, we cannot wait to see what second semester will bring!

The Peer Educators have had the opportunity to hear from guest speakers from the Faculty of Education and Faculty of Global Development Studies and they look forward to lesson planning and practice teaching in the New Year.

The Northern Initiative held a successful Online Silent Auction at the end of November with donations from Grocery Checkout, the Screening Room, the Toronto Maple Leafs and more.
